What is Seesaw?

Seesaw empowers students of any age to independently document what they are learning at school.

Students capture learning with photos and videos of their work, or by adding digital creations. Everything gets organized in one place and is accessible to teachers from any device.

Student work can be shared with classmates, parents, or published to a class blog. Seesaw gives students a real audience for their work and offers parents a personalized window into their child's learning.




Once you tap to open the Seesaw Class app, this screen will appear. Here you can login in as a teacher or student.




- If your class is set up to login with a QR code, this is the poster students will use to scan the QR code using the Seesaw Class app

Note: This poster is emailed to teachers once they establish a Seesaw account.

- Students can scan the QR code once they've tapped "I'm a student" on the first screen
- Once the QR code is scanned, it will give them access to your class account
- Teachers can also choose to set up their account so students can enter a text



Here students will have to choose their name of the class list to enter into their own journal and submit work



This is where students can submit work.

- Take a photo
- Take a video
- Create a drawing
- Import a photo from the camera roll
- Write a note
- Insert a weblink

Note: Work created in many other apps can be exported to Seesaw directly or via a sharing link.
